Involvement

Research

My research sought to examine the exclusion of women's interests and experiences from the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation, and Resettlement Act, 2013 and the subsequent amendment ordinances and bills. While the experiences of women are not identical, there are well known issues impacting the status of women. This includes women's historical and ongoing exclusion from ownership rights, yet their increasing dependence on agricultural employment, in addition to the undervalued and underestimated nature of women's work. For these reasons, the manner in which the Act entitles individuals affected by land acquisition to the awards might disproportionately exclude women from the compensation, rehabilitation, and resettlement benefits. Additionally, the strong link between property retention and women's empowerment should not be ignored within the Act.
